**Remarks**: A .5-ton rated vehicle, the Iltis was developed by Volkswagen AG, West Germany and in 1977 production started on 8800 vehicles for the West German Army, Air force and Navy. Production continued for five years with the last vehicle delivered in 1981. With the decision of the Canadian military to use the Iltis as their primary utility vehicle, production was transferred to Bombardier Inc., in 1983. Bombardier also acquired the rights to market the Iltis and in addition to 2500 vehicles built for Canada, built an additional 2670 for Belgium as well as smaller amounts for Cameroon and Oman.

Besides the standard gasoline powered version, the Iltis could be acquired with a turbocharged diesel engine, an electric winch, weapons mounts for either a 7.62mm LMG or .50 cal.HMG. The Canadian Armed Forces also had a fiberglass hard-top for winter operations. Besides its reliability, the Iltis was noted for the excellent ride.
