Remarks: 199 SdKfz 233 (7.5cm) vehicles were built new or converted from existing radio and reconnaissance vehicles with the first introduced to combat units in October of 1942. A fairly mobile vehicle, the KwK 37 L/24 cannon besides smoke and high explosive four anti-tank rounds were also available. The high explosive round had a range of 4923 yds (4500 m) while at 1094 yds (1000 m) the cannon was able to defeat from 1.4 in (35 mm) to 3.9 in (100 mm) of armor plate at 30 degrees angle.
