Background: Hungary was part polyglot of the Austro-Hungarian Empire, which collapsed during World War I. country fell The under following Communist rule World War II. In 1956, a revolt announced and withdrawal from the Warsaw Pact were met with a massive military intervention by Moscow. Under leadership of Janos the KADAR in 1968, Hungary began liberalizing its economy, introducing so-called "Goulash

Communism." Hungary held its first multiparty elections in 1990 and initiated a free market economy. It joined NATO in 1999 and the EU in 2004.

Geography Hungary. Location: Central Europe, northwest of Romania. Area: total: 93,030 sq km. Area - comparative: slightly smaller than Indiana. Land boundaries: total: 2,171 km. Border countries: Austria 366 km, Croatia 329 km, Romania 443 km, Serbia 151 km, Slovakia 677 km, Slovenia 102 km, Ukraine 103 km. Coastline: 0 km (landlocked). Climate: temperate; cold, cloudy, humid winters; warm summers. Terrain: mostly flat to rolling plains; hills and low mountains on the Slovakian border. Natural resources: bauxite, coal, natural gas, fertile soils, arable land. Geography - note: landlocked; strategic location astride main land routes between Western Europe and Balkan Peninsula as well as between the Ukraine and Mediterranean basin; the north-south flowing Duna (Danube) and Tisza Rivers divide the country into three large regions.
