

Background: The Swiss Confederation was founded in 1291 as a defensive alliance among three cantons. In succeeding years, other localities joined the original three. The Swiss Confederation secured its independence from the Holy Roman Empire in 1499. Swit-zerland's sovereignty and neutrality have long been honored by the major European powers, and the country was not involved in either of the two World Wars. The political and economic integration of Europe over the past half century, as well as Switzerland's role in many UN and international organ-

izations, has strengthened Switzerland's ties with its neighbors. However, the country did not officially become a UN member until 2002. Switzerland remains active in many UN and international organizations, but retains a strong commitment to neutrality.

Remarks: Developed as part of the MOWAG Piranha family during the early 1970s, the 4x4 version failed to arouse any real interest. While the 6x6 and 8x8 versions went into quantity production for a number of different countries, it appears that only Liberia purchased an unknown number of 4x4 variants.

Remarks: A further development of the original 1972 version of the Piranha 4x4, the engine had been changed to a diesel and the transmission to an automatic. Fittings and parts were common to the other Piranha series. Although the weight had gone up the vehicle still had basically the same range and speed as the original design. The 4x4 APC version didn't find any users and remained a prototype

Remarks: Developed from the Piranha 4x4, 6x6 and 8x8 program, the Spy was designed as a reconnaissance vehicle carrying three men rather than a small APC like the Piranha 4x4 with which it shared many parts and assembles. Although different weapon stations could be fitted the view shown is the one-man non-powered turret with one .50 caliber and one 7.62mm machine gun fitted. It was also possible to fit a remote control 7.62mm turret, or a 20mm cannon. Provision was made for a variety of radio installations as well.
